## **Mount Gambier PS News -**

The Mt Gambier Library are being most co operative and are giving the Mt Gambier PS a secure glass display cabinet for a month - free of charge . So we are doing ads for the club and some small displays on aspects of Philately e.g.- postal history, miniature sheets, Post cards, railway postage, etc. They have also let us use a pin board for our displays - We have done some large sheets to try to attract childhood collectors to consider investing in stamps and for older collectors to revive their childhood collections. The Library is also showing books and magazine (Stamp News), that we have in our library, on their round display shelving.

## **The 2011 Briskham Award**

This Award has been presented at the South Australian Annual Congress since 1957 to many outstanding philatelists.

It is awarded to a club member who is considered to have given many years of outstanding service to philately in South Australia. It is named in honour of AG Briskham (FRPSL) who was president of the Philatelic Society of South Australia during the 1950s. He was president of the ANPEX 1955 Council that was responsible for organising the National Stamp Exhibition held in Adelaide during October of that year. That exhibition was held to celebrate the Centenary of the issue of the One Penny stamp, printed by Perkins Bacon & Co of London and first issued in 1855.

A group of philatelists who attended ANPEX 1955 subscribed fifty pounds and presented it to the South Australian Advisory Council. The money was used to establish an award that was to be known as the Briskham Award. This year's worthy recipient is Jennifer Roland who has been involved in philately since 1992, as President of Eastern Districts for the past 8 years and Vice President of the SA Philatelic Council. She has been a prolific fund raiser and has earned wide acclaim for organising the kitchen at many functions such as APF visits , Congress etc., with her band of helpers.

## **The Harry Butler Award.**

Name of Award – Harry Butler Perpetual Trophy

Reason for Award – Meritorious Service at the Club/Society level

Donor – Arthur Bergen - First Awarded – 2011

First Recipient – John Inkster, Eastern Districts Philatelic Society


Process & Criteria – Clubs are eligible to nominate a person from amongst their ranks who has given meritorious service at the individual club or society level and who otherwise would be ineligible for nomination for the higher award, the Briskham Award, which is for meritorious service at the State Level
